



COVID-19 Protocols and Health Policy (2/25/22)

Camps & Classes

We are ecstatic to welcome you and your family back to in-person camps with Noteable Kids this summer! Since keeping everyone, including our teachers, safe and healthy is our top priority, we are providing you with our current health policy based on guidance from public health authorities, such as the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and Tri-County Health. Your attendance in class each day demonstrates your acceptance of and adherence to this policy.

2022 Health Policy for Noteable Kids Arts Center

We ask for your help in keeping all the members of our Noteable Kids community healthy by following these protocols. An inherent risk of exposure to COVID-19 exists in any public place where people are present. COVID-19 is an extremely contagious disease that can lead to severe illness and death. According to the CDC, senior citizens and those with underlying medical conditions are especially vulnerable. By attending class or camp with Noteable Kids, you voluntarily assume all risks related to exposure to COVID-19. Your vigilance and adherence to this health policy is extremely important. Our teachers reserve the right to send a child home from class if they feel these protocols are not being followed.

Mask Policy

- During indoor classes or camps, masking may be required as needed and/or per CDC, Tri County Health and City of Denver policies and recommendations.
- Mask rules apply, even for those who have received a COVID-19 vaccine.
- The use of face coverings is not a substitute for physical distancing.
- When we are outside (which will be as often as possible) masks will not be required unless we are unable to distance appropriately.

Physical Distancing and Class Sizes

- Class sizes will be limited so we may maintain distancing as much as possible.
- We will hold classes outdoors as often as possible.
- We will set up the indoor classroom and outdoor areas to accommodate distancing and guide the kids on how to maintain distancing throughout the classes.

Drop Off & Pick Up Procedures

- Students and teachers ONLY will be permitted in the building for class or camp with the exception of performance day. We will assess current conditions and touch base with you when it comes to performance logistics.
- Please drop your kids off, making sure we are ready to receive them, and wait outside for pick-up.
- No one will be allowed inside before class until the class start time as we will be completing our cleaning regimen between each class.
- Temperatures will be taken as each student enters the building, and students will need to go home if their temperature is above 100.4 and/or if they feel ill or show symptoms of cough, cold or

Classroom Cleaning Protocols

- Classroom surfaces and high touch points will be cleaned and sanitized between all classes.

COVID-19 Procedure and Reporting Policy

- ALL of our teachers are fully vaccinated.
- If someone in your household tests positive for COVID-19 or is exposed to someone who has tested positive, please let us know right away: info@noteablekids.com, and do not come to class until after 14 days have passed.

Illness (Non-Covid-19) Policy

- If you or your child are not feeling well, **please stay home** until you are fully recovered. If you or your child has had a fever, you must be fever-free for at least 24 hours (without assistance of fever-reducing medication) before returning to class.
- If you or your child becomes ill with something contagious after you were in class, please contact us immediately.

Medical Emergency Procedures

Should a child sustain an injury or suffer an illness that requires prompt action to be taken at the site of occurrence, our staff members will:

- Initiate first aid
- Notify child's parents
- Assign an adult staff member to remain with child until parents arrive.
- Obtain child's medical care plan on file and parental consent for emergency treatment for EMS personnel.
- Activate EMS (911) in emergency situation only.

Staff Trained in First Aid and CPR

There shall be at least one staff member onsite who shall have a current certificate indicating completion of a course in Standard First Aid and Personal Safety or Standard First Aid (Modular System) from an accredited training program such as the American Red Cross. Staff shall possess a basic life support cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) certificate as issued by the American National Red Cross or equivalent certifying agency.

There shall be an equipped first aid cabinet with appropriate contents relative to size and activities of the program and a telephone service emergency communications system and procedure.
